Bishop McCort High School Washington & Jefferson College



FOOTBALL

- Led W&J to consecutive Presidents' Athletic Conference football championships and NCAA
 Division III playoff appearances as starting quarterback in 1987 and 1988
- He threw for more than 3,580 yards in his career and was a NCAA Division III Pizza Hut All-American in 1988. He also was an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-American that season
- Mr. Aigner was the Presidents' Athletic Conference Offensive MVP in 1988 and was a first-team All-PAC quarterback that season and second team All-PAC QB in 1987, when he led W&J to an undefeated regular season, a playoff win over Allegheny and into the Southern Region championship game
- · He finished his career as the PAC leader in TD passes in a season and in a game
- Mr. Aigner was inducted into the W&J Pete Henry Hall of Fame in 2006
- As a catcher for the W&J baseball team, he was a four-time All-PAC performer and had a career batting average over .400
- In 1989, Mr. Aigner was named the PAC Baseball Player of the Year
- He was named to the PAC Baseball 60th Anniversary Team





Thomas Jefferson High School University of Dayton/Univ. of Bologna, Italy



YOUTH SERVICE

- For 47 years served student-athletes in Washington County and throughout numerous communities as an altruistic Orthopedic Physician
- In 1972, began as a physician in sports medicine with Washington and Jefferson College, a position he holds today
- Dr. Canterna was hired by the Washington School District in 1974 as the Little Prexies' sports team's doctor. He held that position until 2001
- He served as Canon-McMillan sports team physician from 2002 until 2009
- He has treated and continues to treat all types of sports injuries both surgically and nonsurgically and has overseen the rehabilitation of countless athletes at all age levels
- Dr. Canterna played football and track and field at Clairton High School in 1957 and then played football, basketball and track and field at Thomas Jefferson in 1958-59. He played football at Dayton for three years
- Many of the patients and athletes he has worked with for nearly 50 years will confirm, he is
 one of the most humanistic and philanthropic individuals to serve the young people of our
 area





CURTIS ELLIS

Washington High School Morgan State University


WRESTLING

- Two-time WPIAL Class AAA champion and PIAA semifinalist in 1977, losing to three-time PIAA champion and Olympic gold medalist, Bob Weaver, on a late takedown. Weaver, so impressed with Ellis' near upset, raised Ellis arm as his own was raised in victory
- Mr. Ellis was a three-time NCAA Division II All-American (1978, 1979 and 1981) for Morgan State University in Baltimore, all at 118 pounds
- He was undefeated in his collegiate career against MEAC Conference competition (36-0) and was undefeated at home against non-conference competition
- Mr. Ellis was a four-time MEAC champion and two-time East Regional champion (1980-1981). He was invited to and won the Penn State Invitational in 1980 and was ranked eighth in the NCAA Division I national rankings in 1980
- He was a team captain and completed his collegiate career with a 102-17-1 record
- Mr. Ellis was inducted into Morgan State's Sports Hall of Fame in 2015. He was a key
 performer on Wash High's undefeated dual team in 1976. The Little Prexies finished as
 WPIAL Cass AAA runners up



JUSTIN EVANS

Peters Township High School Penn State University/St. Bonaventure



ATHLETE OF DISTINCTION - SOCCER

- Enjoyed a 10-year professional soccer career, playing in the Major League Soccer (San Jose, Chicago & Dallas); also played for the Pittsburgh Riverhounds and Charleston Battery (A-League/USL); the 1st Division Poland (Petro Plock), 2nd Division Poland (Lechia Gdansk) and in the Major Indoor Soccer League (Cleveland Force/Crunch & Kansas City Comets)
- He was a professional coach for the Pittsburgh Riverhounds from 2010-2014
- Mr. Evans was inducted into the first Pittsburgh Riverhounds Hall of Fame Class of July 2019
- He was an All-American plater at Peters Township HS and earned a scholarship to Penn State
- Mr. Evans played at Penn State for three years and then transferred to Bonaventure for his senior year where he was two-time Atlantic 10 Player of the Week and All-Atlantic10 second team
- He was the first draft of the Pittsburgh Riverhounds and team captain in 2003. He was second in A-League in assists in 1999 in the 28-team league
- At Peters Township, he scored 45 goals with 25 assists and was an All-State player



JUSTIN GREGULA

Washington High School Old Dominion University

BASEBALL



- Led Wash High to the WPIAL Class AA championship in 2002.
- He batted .446 in 2002, went 4-2 as a pitcher and hit a three-run triple in the WPIAL championship game
- Mr. Gregula was an All-Section baseball performer three years and a four-year starter
- A three-year starter at Old Dominion, he hit .286 in his career with 186 hits, 30 doubles, nine home runs and 93 RBI. He had a .447 slugging percentage, .324 on-base percentage and a .771 OPS. As a senior, he had 19 multiple-hit games, starting all 51 of the Monarchs' games. He hit .295 or better in all of his final three seasons
- Mr. Gregula led the Little Prexies to the 2001 PIAA and WPIAL football Class AA championships as starting quarterback, placekicker and punter
- He threw 39 touchdown passes in his career, a school record that stood for 17 years. In his senior season, he threw for more than 1,400 yards and 18 TDs. More than 33 percent of his completions in his two seasons as a starter went for TDs
- His 113-career kicked extra-points and single-season 57 extra-points kicked are school records
- Mr. Gregula is one of few kickers to make field goals at both Three Rivers Stadium and Heinz Field
- He also played in WPIAL championship games at Three Rivers Stadium, Heinz Field and PNC Park
- Mr. Gregula played for the Washington Wild Things in 2007, hitting two doubles and two home runs with an .806 OPS in 10 games as a third baseman
- He played on the 2006 NABF Collegiate Summer League World Series championship team, playing for the Pittsburgh Pandas. He was the NABF Tournament Team third baseman
- Played on the 2000 Keystone Games baseball championship team
- Tied a Pony World Series record with three pitching victories and helped Washington to finish as the PWS runner up in 1998



HOWARD HACKLEY

Canon-McMillan High School Edinboro University





- He was a standout three-sport athlete at Canon-McMillan High School in football, wrestling and track, earning nine letter, winning a section wrestling championship in 1973 and being named All-Conference in football in 1972-73
- Mr. Hackley was an All-American football player at Edinboro University as a receiver and was inducted into the school's athletic Hall of Fame for football and track and field in 1988
- He made 135 catches for 2,476 yards for the Fighting Scots and scored 18 career TDs. He held several other school receiving records upon graduation including 47 receptions in a single season, 190 receiving yards in a game, nine receptions in a game, among others
- Mr. Hackley was named prior to this 150th season of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference as one of the 150 most influential players/coach in the conference's history
- He was the NAIA District 18 MVP in 1976 and was first-team All-West Division in 1973-76 and a second-team NAIA All-American
- He was named as recipient of the Sox Harrison Award as Senior Male Athlete of the Year in 1977
- Mr. Hackley held track records at Edinboro, including 100 mete4rs (10.3), 4x100 relay team (40.08), 4x400 relay team (3:15)
- He played for a handful of teams in the Canadian Football League, including for the Montreal Allouettes in the 1977 Grey Cup, the CFL championship game
- Mr. Hackley also played for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Toronto Argonauts of the CFL
- He went to camp with the Cleveland Browns in 1977



MARK KERN

Canon-McMillan High School Washington and Jefferson College

FOOTBALL



- He was a defensive standout and stalwart as a defensive tackle at W&J from 1985-1988.
- Mr. Kern was a four-year letterman for the Presidents.
- He was one of 10 student-athletes in W&J College history named to the Associated Press Little All-America Football Team in 1988.
- He is one of the top tacklers in school history with 275 and he left W&J as the second all-time leader in quarterback sacks with 34.
- In 1986 and 1987, he led the Presidents in sacks.
- After the 1988 season, Mr. Kern was chosen as Pizza Hut All-American. He was a two-time, first-team All-PAC honoree and had 113 tackles (25 for loss), including 14 sacks in 1987.
- Mr. Kern is a member of W&J's College Athletics HOF, inducted in 2008.



JOE MAIZE

Waynesburg Central High School Slippery Rock University Long time Coach Peters Township





- He coached baseball at Peters Township High School for 35 years, retiring after the 2019 season with a record of 422-241 (.637 winning percentage)
- Mr. Maize led the Indians to WPIAL Class 4-A championships in 2007 and 2008, two silver medals in the PIAA in 2004 and 2005, eight section titles, 17 WPIAL playoff appearances and five PIAA playoff appearances
- Under Maize, Peters Township had eight players sign professional contracts and three played in the major leagues, including Chris Peters (Pirates and Montreal Expos), Brian Simmons (Chicago White Sox and Toronto Blue Jays) and Jordan Jankowski (Houston Astros)
- Other Indians drafted or signed by MLB organizations were Joe Kail, Jason DiAngelo, Jimmy Gallagher, Jimmy Rider and Justin Bianco. The Indians' program produced more than 100 players who played collegiately
- In addition to his long tenure as Peters Township baseball coach, Mr. Maize was the Indians' athletic director
 for many years and coached a variety sports along the way, including varsity girls basketball and girls softball,
 among other middle school and ninth grade positions
- He was athletic director from 1986 to 2006 and was assistant AD from 1983-1986
- WPIAL Baseball Coaches Association Vice President for over 15 years
- WPIAL Baseball Coaches Association AAA Coach of the Year 2006
- Tri-County AD Association Coach of the Year for Baseball: 2004-2005, 2005-2006, 2007-2008, 2008-2009
- Big 56 Conference Section 3 Coach of the Year 2019
- While Athletic Director at Peters Township he was actively involved with the Tri-County AD Association as the VP, Secretary, and President at various times throughout his 20 years as an AD
- While AD at PTHS he was actively involved with the WPIAL as a member of the WPIAL Soccer Steering Committee. He has been a member of the Soccer Committee for 34 years. Joe has served as the Chairman of the Soccer Committee for the past 7 years



JONATHAN W. MILES II

Washington High School Boston College



FOOTBALL

- Named to the Pennsylvania State football team as an offensive tackle in 1993
- He was an All-Conference selection
- Miles was a member of the 1993 WPIAL champion football team at Wash High. The team was the first in Washington County history to make the PIAA finals
- He was a member of the 1993 Post-Gazette's Fabulous 22
- He received a full scholarship to play at Boston College
- Miles was a three-year letterman for the Eagles from 1995-97, starting his senior year in 1997 at left tackle
- He received the Gerald B. Healy Award for Academic Excellence





Trinity High School Slippery Rock University Long time Coach Immaculate Conception




COACH - BASKETBALL

- Compiled a 231-93 record as girls basketball coach at the former Immaculate Conception High School from 1973-1986
- Ms. Mosley's teams at IC advanced to the WPIAL finals three times and the Lady Comets became the first girls team in Washington County to win a WPIAL championship in 1986
- She was a three-time recipient of the Washington County Coach of the Year
- Ms. Mosley coached volleyball at IC as well, winning Class AA sections titles in 1980 and 1981
- She established the women's volleyball program at Waynesburg College and posted an overall record of 175-32 from 1984-88
- Ms. Mosley led the Yellow Jackets to the NAIA District 18 championship, advancing to the national tournament in Kansas City
- She was the long-time chairwoman of the WPIAL softball steering committee



WADE TIMMERSON

Fort Cherry High School Robert Morris University



BASKETBALL

- Led the WPIAL in scoring in the 1987-88 season, averaging 30.4 points per game, still a rare feat today
- Mr. Timmerson completed his three-year career at Fort Cherry with more than 1,400 points.
 He was the Observer-Reporter's Player of the Year in 1988 and it's Player of the Decade of the 1980s
- He scored 56 points against Sewickley Academy in 1988 in a 90-59 win for the Rangers
- At Robert Morris, he helped the Colonials to three NCAA Tournaments in four seasons
- He was inducted into the University's Hall of Fame in 2007
- Mr. Timmerson established a single-season record at RMU for assist-to-turnover ratio
 (2.02) while ranking third in assists per game (4.1) and fourth in assists overall with 484
- He was a four-year letterman and in the 1991-92 season, he became the first Colonial to record more than 200 assists in a season when he had 204
- He scored 868 points at RMU. Mr. Timmerson played one season in the World Basketball League for the Erie Wave



JON VALLINA

Burgettstown High School Slippery Rock University

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR





- He served as director of the Burgettstown Invitational Wresting Tournament for 36 years and established the Burgettstown Area Scholarship Foundation, which has raised more than \$240,000 to fund scholarships for high school seniors
- President of the Southwest PA Junior Golf Tour from 1990 to 2017. The Tour had membership of over 200 junior golfers each summer and hosted 12 tournaments at local courses.
- He was Burgettstown's athletic director for 28 years, was an assistant football coach for eight years, and an assistant wrestling coach for 16 years
- He was president of the Tri-County Athletic Director's Association from 1998-2000 and was director of the TRICADA Golf tournament from 2005 – 2012
- Mr. Vallina was the President of the WPIAL AD Association from 2000-2002, was a member of the Executive Committee from 1993 to 2013 and helped establish the New AD Mentoring Program in the WPIAL.
- He was twice named Pennsylvania Athletic Director of the Year (1999 & 2002) and won the NIAAA State Award of Merit in 2000 and inducted into the Pennsylvania State Athletic Director's Association Hall of Fame (2018) and was president of PSADA from 2000 to 2002
- He was a member of the WPIAL Board of Control from 2000 to 2013 and served as Treasurer from 2006-2010 and Vice-President from 2010-2013





FRANK ZEBRASKY

Washington High School West Liberty State College



FOOTBALL

- Was the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year in 1979. He was also named honorable mention punter and place kicker that season
- Mr. Zebrasky, who graduated from West Liberty with nine offensive school records, was also an NAIA honorable mention All-American in 1979, throwing for 1,200 yards and leading the WVIAC in scoring with 56 points
- After an 0-2 start, Zebrasky led the Hilltoppers to a WVIAC championship, winning seven straight games before tying Fairmont State, 6-6, in the final game
- At Wash High, he was a member of the 1977 WPIAL runnerup baseball team, an All-Century Conference football player, an All-Section basketball player, team captain and the winner of the 1978 William E. Amos Award, as Wash High's outstanding senior athlete
- Mr. Zebrasky set a school record at Wash High for assists in a game with 21 in 1978
- He has been a long-time coach, serving as an assistant on two WPIAL title teams and a PIAA championship team at Wash High. He was an assistant baseball coach in 2002 when the Little Prexies won a WPIAL crown. He also was manager for Washington in the 2001 and 2003 Pony World Series', was Canon-McMillan's baseball coach from 2008-2015 with three consecutive playoff appearances (2013-15)
- Mr. Zebrasky served as Canon-McMillan (2010-15) and Carlynton girls basketball coach (2017-18) and currently coaches Carlynton's baseball team, where the Cougars have made three straight post-season appearances
- He played in the 1980 Thorobred World Series for Washington in Norfolk, VA





1998 WASHINGTON LITTLE PREXIES

TEAM OF YESTERYEAR - BASEBALL

- Won the PIAA and WPIAL Class AA championships
- The Little Prexies went 20-3, winning four PIAA games. The team's average margin of victory in its 20 wins was 8.62 per victory
- In eight post-season victories, Wash High scored 86 runs and allowed just 17, an average of 10.75 runs per game while yielding just a bit more than two runs a game
- The team won the WPIAL title with a 7-0 victory over previously undefeated Freeport as Diontae Walker threw a no-hitter at Three Rivers Stadium
- Wash High won the PIAA crown with a 13-3 whitewashing of Wyalusing. Joe Gregula
 had two hits, drove in four runs and started a double play in the third inning with the Little
 Prexies holding a one-run lead
- The team was coached by Bob Peton, a 2004 inductee into the Washington-Greene Co. Chapter Hall of Fame. Scott Belcastro, a 2012 inductee, was a member of the 1998 team



SPECIAL HONOREE

HARRY HARVEY (Posthumous)

HARNESS RACING



- Mr. Harvey was inducted into the Western Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame in 1970 and the Harness Racing Living Hall of Fame in July 2002
- He excelled as a trainer, driver and farm manager for the finest Standardbreds.
- Mr. Harvey was born in Duxbury, Vermont in 1923.
- While second trainer for Hall of Famer, Delvin Miller, Mr. Harvey won the 1953 Hambletonian with Helicopter.
- He went on to manage Miller's Meadow Lands Farm from 1954 to the late 1960s. Mr. Harvey was
 the architect of the union between the mare Countess Vivian and Dale Frost. The subsequent foal,
 which was born on the farm, was the great pacing stallion Meadow Skipper.
- Following the death of Adios, he returned to driving and training. In 1969 his UDRS was the best in the country at .508 for 200299 starts. The following year, he led the UDRS with .462 points for 300 or more starts, all with horses he trained.
- Mr. Harvey also drove horses to wins in the Old Oaken Bucket, Prix d'Ete, the Harriman Cup, La Paloma, the Fox and Sheppard Stake, the Mistletoe Shalee, the Roosevelt Pace, Geers, Debutante and the American National.
- He started his own breeding farm, Arden Hills, named after a nearby village. It had been an annex
 of Meadow Lands Farm, where he had spent the previous 12 as manager. It was at nearby Arden
 Downs that he developed, trained and drove Albatross, two time Horse of the Year and 1996 Hall of
 Famer.
- Mr. Harvey was also vice president of the Western Pennsylvania (The Meadows) Harness
 Horsemen's Association from 1962-1966. He served on the boards of both the Washington Trotting
 Association and the William Penn at Liberty Bell.



SPECIAL HONOREE

AL HELFER (Posthumous)

BROADCASTING



- Nicknamed "Mr. Radio Baseball," Helfer was awarded the Ford C. Frick Award for Excellence in Baseball Broadcasting from the Baseball Hall of Fame, December 12, 2018 and inducted in August 2019
- Mr. Helfer was born in Elrama (September 26, 1911), Washington County, and played football and basketball at Washington and Jefferson College and worked as a sports reporter for the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette.
- He called football games for the Pittsburgh Pirates (as they were called then) and Pittsburgh Panthers. He began broadcasting recreations of Pittsburgh Pirates baseball games in 1933.
- He worked for the Cincinnati Reds and then joined CBS in 1937, working football and baseball. Mr. Helfer was reunited with Red Barber, whom he worked with in Cincinnati, when he started broadcasting Brooklyn Dodgers games in 1937.
- Mr. Helfer joined the Navy during World War II before doing "Game of the Day broadcasts for Mutual.
- He rejoined the Dodgers and also called games for the New Yrk Yankees, Philadelphia Phillies, Houston Colt .45s, Denver Broncos and Oakland Athletics.
- Mr. Helfer broadcast the MLB All-Star game (1939, 1950-1958; the World Series (1945, 1951-1955 and 1957) and Jim "Catfish' Hunter's 1968 perfect game.
- He broadcast the Army-Navy game during the 1940s and 1950s, and several Rose Bowl games.
- Mr. Helfer died in 1975 at 63.







1958 CALIFORNIA VULCANS

TEAM OF YESTERYEAR - FOOTBALL

- California went 8-0 and outscored their opposition 207-31 —scoring 25.9 points per game yielding just 2.9 points per game.
- California's average margin of victory was 22 points. The Vulcans recorded four shutouts. Their two closest wins were by 13 points over Indiana and Edinboro.
- The undefeated regular season is one of only three in the school's history.
- The Vulcans led the nation in rushing defense yielding a paltry 42 yards per game and was ranked second nationally in total defense.
- In addition to the victories over Indiana and Edinboro, California defeated Lock Haven, Shippensburg, Slippery Rock, Clarion, Susquehanna and Washington and Jefferson.
- The team's catalysts were Pete Petroff an offensive lineman who transferred from Penn State — and the late Jack Scarvel, who returned to California after serving in the Army. Petroff anchored the offensive line while Scarvel provided the soul of the Vulcans' defense from his nose tackle position in the middle of the unit.
- The team was coached by Ted Nemeth. His assistants were Bill Hepner, Andy Sepsi, Mitch Bailey, Fran Herron, Gary Kennedy and Steve Tselepis.
- A number of players on that team are members of the Cal U Hall of Fame including, guard Fleming Mosely, Scarvel, running back Phil Clifford, defensive back Frank Bernadowski and offensive lineman Dick Fields.
- Nemeth is also in the Hall of Fame. He was also named the Pittsburgh Dapper Dan and Curbstone coaches "Small College Coach of the Year" in 1958.



<u>COURAGE AWARD</u> RECIPIENTS

LUKE BLANOCK

Canon-McMillan High School



Luke Blanock was an athlete whose battle with a rare form of bone cancer (Ewing's Sarcoma) inspired many athletes, coaches, fans and all of Western Pennsylvania sports in general. Blanock played basketball and baseball at Canon-McMillan. After undergoing treatment for the cancer, Blanock played some for the Canon-McMillan basketball team in the 2014-15 season. The cancer returned, but it didn't deter Blanock. Despite undergoing chemotherapy treatments, Blanock started a baseball game at pitcher in the spring of 2015. Luke passed away in December 2017. He was honored and memorialized with the WPIAL's John Challis Courage Award in 2016.

JAMES C. (JIMMY) MONTECALVO

Washington High School Bethany College

In his short life, Jimmy battled cancer that led to a multitude of challenges. A positive outlook and determination led him to success in life and sports. At Washington High School, he enjoyed success as a wide-receiver and kicker in football, and as a stellar performer on the golf and track teams. An honor student, he was named an All-Star Achiever by the Post-Gazette as a senior. He graduated magna cum laude from Bethany College and pursued his life's work as a sports journalist. He was emerging as an excellent writer, researcher and storyteller. Regardless of the task, Jimmy was always smiling as he toiled until there was no more to give. Jimmy passed away in June 2008 at the age of 26. He was honored and memorialized with the WPIAL's John Challis Courage Award in 2010.



<u>HALL OF FAME</u> <u>MOMENTS</u>

P.J. HUGHES



P.J. Hughes hit a dramatic pinch-hit, walk-off home run to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning to help the Washington Pony All-Star team pull within one win of advancing to the 1998 Pony League World Series championship game with a 3-2 win over Pasadena, Texas. It was Hughes' first at bat of the series. His home run caused the monstrous crowd at Lew Hays Pony Field to erupt in celebration. It was one of the most dramatic and euphoric finishes in PLWS history.



JOE GREGULA

Joe Gregula pitched the only recorded perfect game in the history of California University of Pa. baseball history, May 12, 1970, against Gannon. He retired 18 straight batters through six innings, six strikeouts, five flyballs, and six groundball outs. He caught a short pop in front of the mound for the first out of the seventh inning, assisted on the second out and struck out the final batter. Gregula also had two singles and a walk for the Vulcans, who won 7-0.

Ironically, Gregula was Hughes' manager in the 1998 Pony League World Series.
